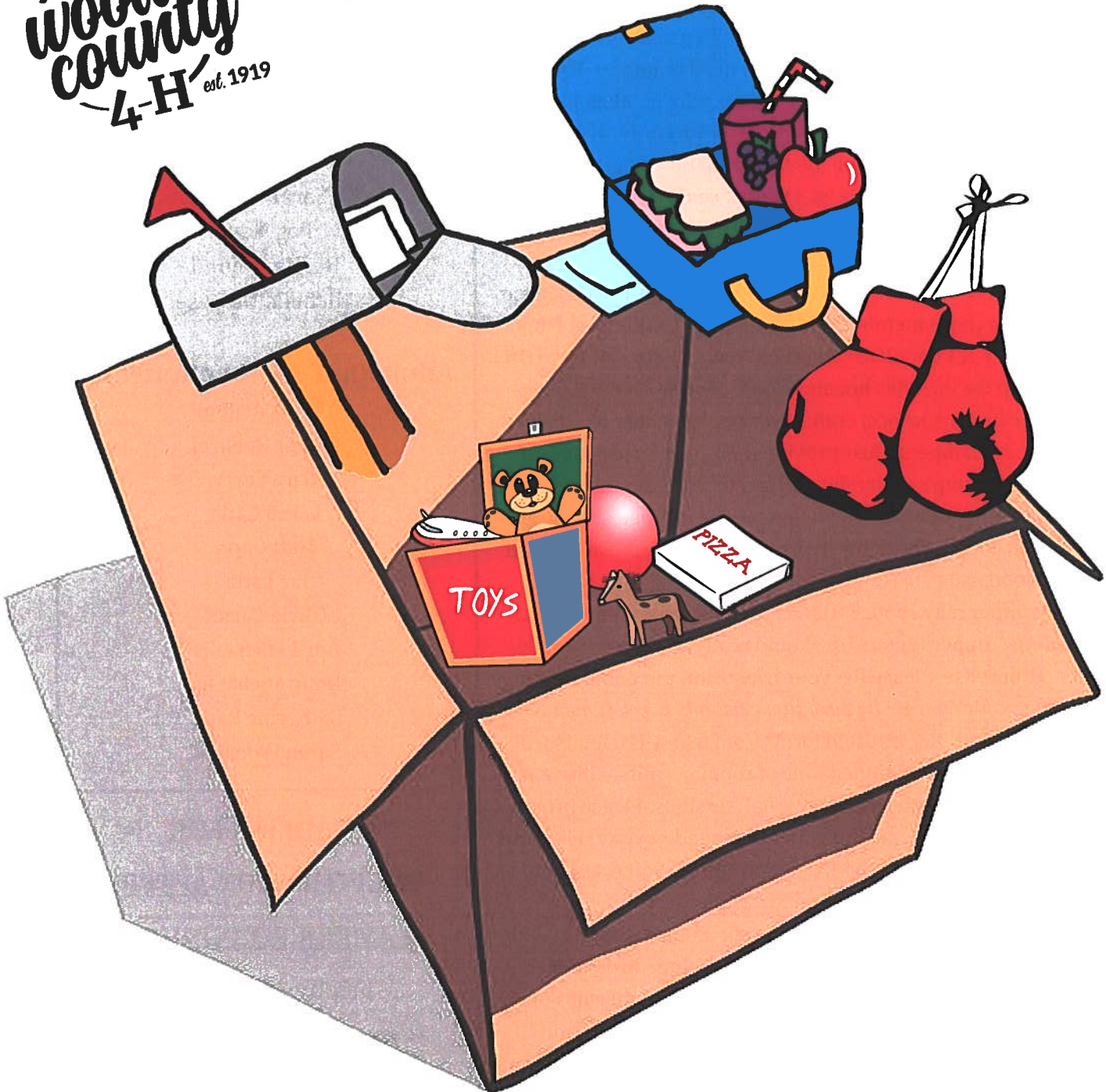

Dear 4-H Member,
Wood County 4-H Camp is quickly approaching! Camp will be held this year Friday, June 14th (3:00 p.m.) through Tuesday, June 18th (10:30 a.m.) at 4-H Camp Palmer near Fayette, Ohio. All 4-H members 9 years old (or completing the 3rd grade) through 14 years old (or completing 8th grade) are invited to attend.

Wood County 4-H Camper Round-up will be held May 9th at the fairgrounds! ***WE WOULD HIGHLY RECOMMEND THAT YOU ATTEND CAMPER ROUND-UP TO REGISTER!*** Please see the enclosed information sheet for everything you need to know. If you cannot attend Camper Round-Up, reservations will be taken in person on a first come, first serve basis (after May 9th) or in the mail until May 24th or until camp is full. Be aware that if you attend Camper Round-Up you are not guaranteed a spot at camp; we only have so many beds but we will do our best to arrange beds to accommodate the most campers possible!

The camp fee this year is \$217.00, however for registering at Camper Round-Up those members will receive a \$10 discount from the Wood County 4-H Committee and the Wood County 4-H Bake Off Committee. Camp fee includes housing, food, a nurse on duty, qualified lifeguards, camp insurance, crafts, t-shirt, plus a host of other camp experiences. Campers must provide their own transportation to and from camp. Camp scholarship winners are chosen in mid April by 4-H Committee members and winners will be notified shortly after the selection. Each camper may choose friends to bunk with at camp. Those attending Camper Round-Up should read the insert carefully for benefits. Otherwise, please list your friends on the Cabin Buddy Worksheet reservation form. *Be sure these friends are 4-H members and are going to camp.* Registration forms from non-4-H friends will be accepted after the May 24th deadline, if room permits. This year, we will also be offering a variety of optional sessions. Please bring your choices to Camper Round-Up! Otherwise send in your selections with your registration form to the Extension Office. Some sessions fill up quickly so please have a 2nd and 3rd choice.

At Camper Round-Up or after you sign up for camp, you will receive an email with details on what to take to camp, directions on how to get there, arrival and departure times, and general rules of 4-H camp. A fun-filled camp has been planned for you this year and I hope that you will be able to join the more than 250 other 4-H members from Wood County for this exciting week!

All About 4-H Camp Palmer

Wood County 4-H Camp is held at 4-H Camp Palmer, a resident camp located about 60 miles northwest of Bowling Green. The camp's 146 acres are located next to Harrison Lake State Park. 4-H Camp is privately owned and has a proud heritage and the tradition of wholesome educational and recreational activities.

What is 4-H Camp like?

At camp we want you to have fun and learn many things. You will make friends with boys and girls from across the county who have ideas different from your own. You will get to know the outdoors quite well as this is where we spend most of our time. You will become skilled in a variety of program activities, which you will attend every day. You will learn to get along with others and compete in various fun activities with team members of your assigned "group". Swimming will be held several times daily and there will always be plenty of fun and exciting things for you to enjoy. You will never be bored!

Where will I sleep?

Campers live in cabins near the central area of camp. Each camper has his/her own bunk and area for personal belongings. Boys and girls bunk in separate cabins, which are separated by a stream. You may request to stay in the same cabin with your friends, please indicate friends on your cabin buddy sheet.

What will I eat?

Home-style meals are served in the large, comfortable dining hall. Three family-style meals and an evening snack are the tradition of camp and the food is delicious.

Roughing it...Outpost Camping

Come spend the night out with us in the Adirondack shelter. An adult member of the camp staff leads a group each night, conducting an evening program which includes cooking over an open fire, learning some camping skills, star-gazing, folklore, and sleeping overnight in the shelter. Campers out posting will not miss any regular camp programs. If you are interested in out posting, you will have a chance to sign-up at camp.
